OVERVIEW

- Located in Winnipeg, Manitoba
- Located on original homeland of Anishinaabeg, Cree, Ojibwe-Cree, Dakota and Dene peoples, and on the National Homeland of the Red River Métis
- Oldest university in Western Canada (founded 1877)
- Two campuses – Faculty of Architecture is located on the Fort Garry campus (buildings marked →)
- Master of Architecture offered alongside Urban Planning, Landscape Architecture and Interior Design graduate programs



PROGRAM

- The Master of Architecture is a 2-year accredited professional program
- Focus on making, interconnectivity, place and improving quality of the built environment
- Balance of technical to artistic aspects
- Excellent facilities + tunnel connections
- Small studio sizes + large mobile desks
- Diverse, large proportion of out-of-province and international students



APPLICATIONS

- **Deadlines:** December 1st (International) and January 15th (Canadian, US)
- Reviewed by committee in March, typically hear back in April for first round of acceptances
- Waitlist open until start of term



CLASSES

- 48 credit hours required
- Majority of courses in fall and winter semesters, with additional electives available during summer

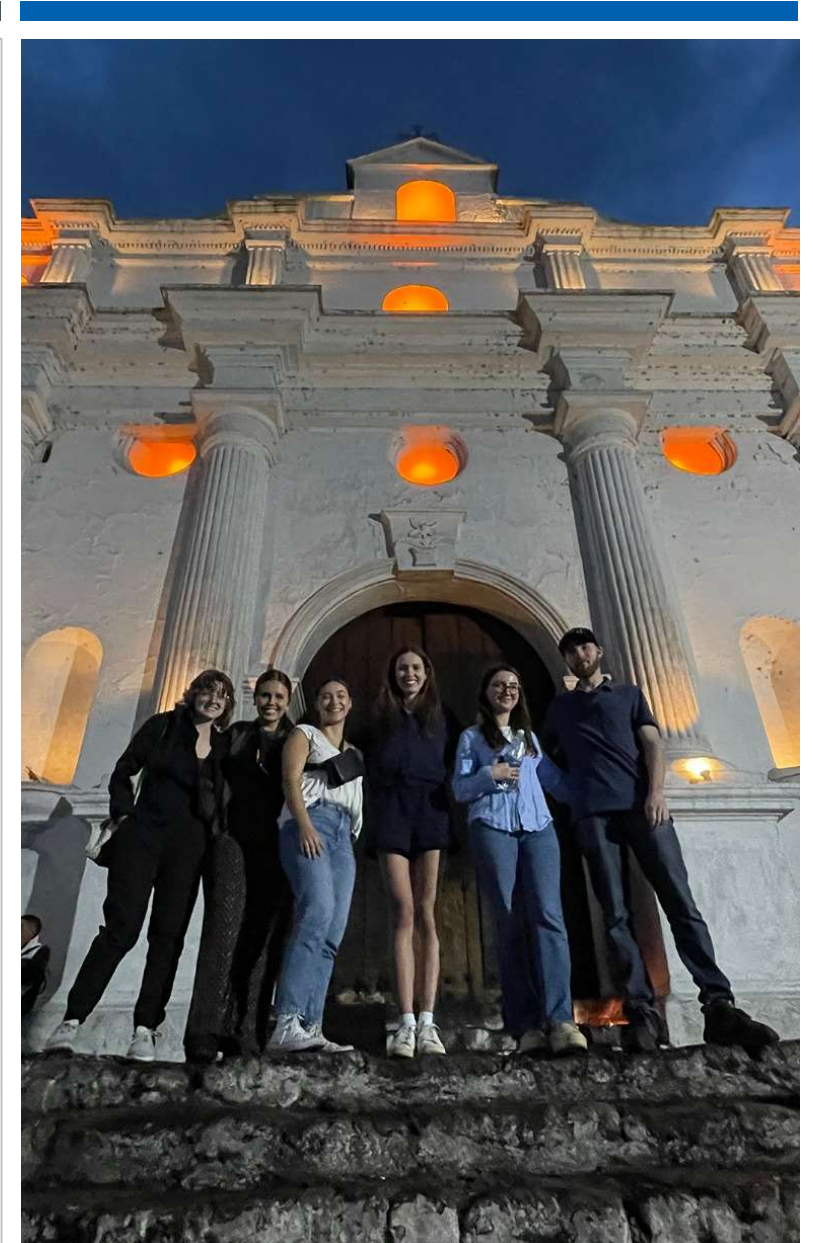

STUDIO

First Year (M1)

- 3 – 4 studios each year
- Runs through fall and winter term unless noted otherwise
- Each has a theme and associated field trip (ex. New York, Guatemala, Berlin, Iceland)



STUDIO

Second Year (M2, Thesis)

- One advisor for year, drawn from throughout the faculty
- Intensive Research, Study and Design exploration into an interest
- Work is exhibited at events throughout the city and online

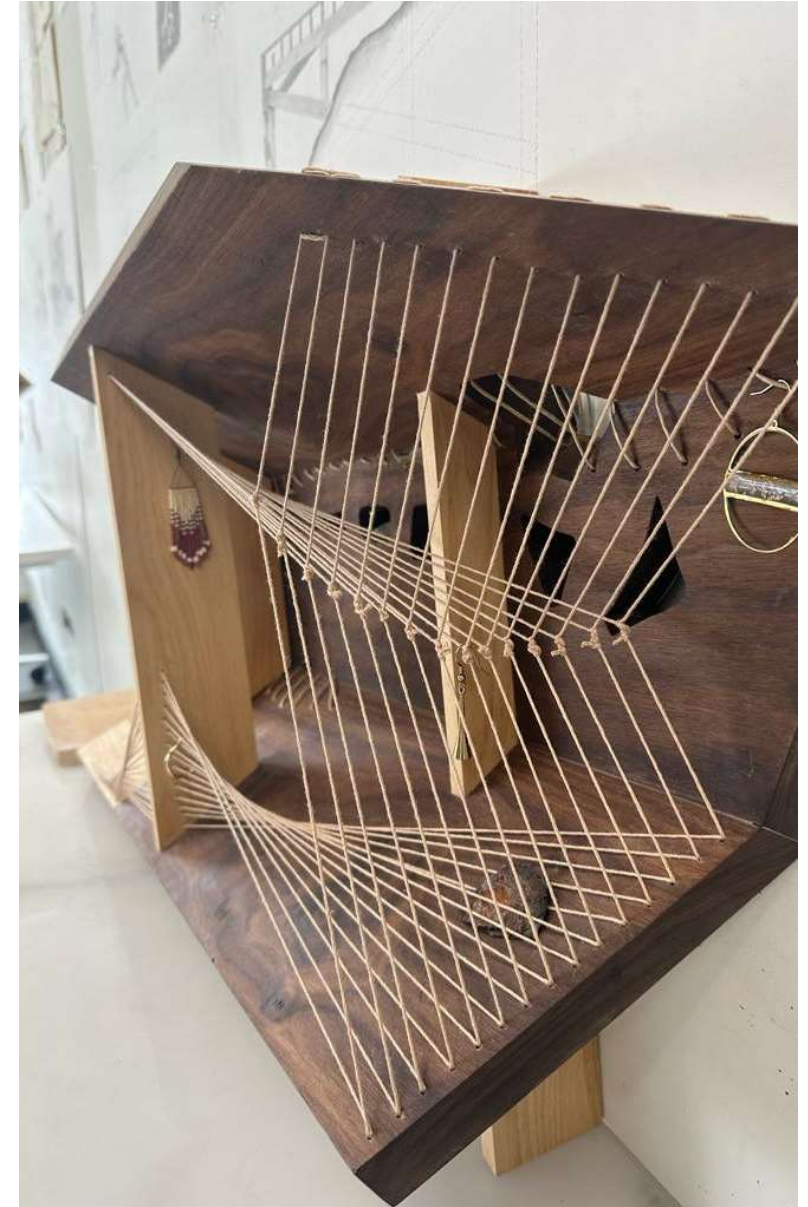


STUDIO

Masters Preparation Option (AMP/M0)

- Prerequisite year to meet Master of Architecture program requirements
- Applicable for those without design undergrad or from an adjacent field
- May be in an undergraduate or graduate studio
- Program currently transitioning into M0, advise checking with Tobi

ELECTIVES

- **Current Courses:** Masonry; Lighting and Shadows; Berlin: Life of a City; Composing Home: Meaning, Memory and Making; Communication for Architects; Deep Space – Mining Meaning; Beton Waves; Slowing Down; Being a Good Relative; Frozen Structures; Architecture and Narrative
- **Past Courses include:** Biomimetics, BIM, Theatres of Architectural Imagination, Thinking Brutalist Architecture, and Technology and Indigenous knowledge
- Courses tied to current faculty and their areas of expertise



ADVISORS

- One advisor for year, from throughout the faculty
- Student chooses advisor each year, but cannot have the same M1 advisor for M2
- Advisor acts as mentor, with more direct guidance + requirements in M1. During M2, relationship usually more advisory but up to the

CO-OPS

- 4-month paid work term in companies throughout Canada
- Typically done in summer
- Cover letters, resumes and portfolio sessions are offered in winter semester to help prepare
